

# First National Tourism Conclave 2022

#### **Introduction to NATHM**

Nepal Academy of Tourism and Hotel Management (NATHM), with its history of five decades of services in tourism and hotel management education, has been playing a crucial role in developing human resources and enhancing the standard of quality in tourism and hospitality services by providing craft and supervisory level skill-oriented training to cater to the demands of the industry since its inception in 1972 as Hotel Management and Tourism Training Centre (HMTTC). In 1999, NATHM launched the Bachelor of Hotel Management (BHM) program and in 2003, Bachelor of Travel and Tourism Management (BTTM) program in affiliation with Tribhuvan University.

As the industry has grown rapidly over the past decades, the need for professionally trained higher level Human resources as also increased simultaneously. To cater to the present demand of the industry, NATHM has launched a two-year Master of Hospitality Management (MHM) program affiliated to Tribhuvan University (TU) in 2011 and aims to produce senior-level human resources.

Along with the academic courses, NATHM runs the short-term training courses on tourism and hospitality in-house at its campus at Rabi Bhawan, Kathmandu and also reaches out to different parts and parcels of the country in the form of Mobile Outreach training. To date, NATHM has produced more than 57000 human resources from training and academic programs.

#### **About the Conclave**

Nepal Academy of Tourism and Hotel Management (NATHM) with the aim of discussing myriads of issues and challenges of the Nepalese tourism industry and chalking the roadmap for the revival of the Nepalese tourism industry after the Covid-19 pandemic is planning to organize a National Tourism Conclave from 6<sup>th</sup> September, 2022 to 8<sup>th</sup>September, 2022 (Bhadra 21, 2079 Bhadra 23, 2079).

The aim of this program is to bring together all the stakeholders of the Nepalese Tourism and Hospitality Industry through which the exchange of each other's concerns, issues, opportunities and ideas would take place thereby leading to a comprehensive understanding of the status of the industry and seeking the way forward, especially after the Covid-19.

At the same time, this event will be the first of its kind which will provide a common platform for everyone involved in tourism and hospitality to share their ideas and learn from the experience of the industry across the globe and also from the legendary contributors of Nepalese tourism and hospitality industry.

#### The objectives of this event are:

- 1. To engage and facilitate Nepalese Tourism and Hospitality Stakeholders toward holistic, progressive and sustainable tourism development.
- 2. To explore and propose ways to revive and sustain the tourism industry in the context of the Covid-19 pandemic.
- 3. To brainstorm on the present state of tourism products/ development and lead the discussion towards innovation in the existing tourism products/ development.
- 4. To facilitate discourse/s on innovative disruptions and find ways to integrate those innovations into the Nepalese tourism and hospitality industry.
- 5. To create a knowledge platform where the legendary contributors of the Nepalese Tourism and Hospitality Industry sharetheir stories with the young tourism and hospitality aspirants.
